Ord. (1) State All-Terrain Vehicle Laws Adopted

- (a) The provisions describing and defining regulations with respect to all-terrain vehicles in the following enumerated Subsections of Sec. 23.33, WI. Stats. and any future amendments or revisions, are hereby adopted by reference and made part of this Section as if fully forth herein. Any acts required to be performed by the Section or are prohibited by this Section.

Ord. (2) Designated all-terrain routes

(a) Purpose

- (1) To establish all-terrain vehicle routes to connect routes to trails and routes to provide safe enjoyable all-terrain vehicle recreation consistent with public rights and interest.

(b) Applicability, Enforcement, and Penalties.

- (1) The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to the following roads, including roadways completely within the jurisdiction of the Town. The provisions of that Ordinance shall be

enforced by the Adams County Sheriff's Dept. in accordance with the Wisconsin State Statutes.

- (c) Operation: All-terrain vehicles shall only be operated on the traveled portions of the designated routes and access only routes.
- (d) Access Only Routes: Landowners and their guests may operate all-terrain vehicles on Town Highways that are not Designated Routes provided such operation is for the sole purpose of traveling between the Landowner's property and a Designated route. Further, such operation must follow the shortest and most direct route for traveling between the Landowner's property and Designated Route.

(e) Areas Designated:

- (1) CTY Hwy Z South from the edge of the Castle Rock Lake bridge to Birch Ave.
- (2) Birch Ave. West to Blackhawk St.
- (3) Blackhawk St. south to Dell Ave.
- (4) Dell Ave. West to Town Rd. & East across CTY Z on Deerborn Dr. to 18th Ave. South to Dover Dr.
- (5) Town Rd. south to Rito Ave.
- (6) Rito Ave West to Market St.
- (7) Market St. South to Kendtorff Ave.
- (8) Kendtorff East to Olmstead St.
- (9) Olmstead St. South to Kraft Ave.
- (10) Kraft Ave. East to Town Rd.
- (11) Town Rd. South to Dover Dr.
- (12) Dover Dr. east across CTY Z to 18th Ave.
- (13) 18th. Ave South across CTY F to Dyke Ave.
- (14) Dyke Ave. West to CTY Z
- (15) CTY Z South from Dover Dr. to Dyke Ave.
- (16) Edgewood Ave. West to 19th Dr. & east to 16th. Ave.
- (17) 16th Ave. South to Evergreen Ave.
- (18) Evergreen Ave. West to CTY Z and East to the end of Town Quincy line.

(d) Signing

- (1) The area shall be designated by an all-terrain vehicle route sign having a reflectorized white all-terrain vehicle symbol, bordered and message on a reflectorized green background with a minimum size of 24 inches by 18 inches with directional arrow, where appropriate, placed

at the beginning of an all-terrain route and at such locations and intervals as necessary to enable the all-terrain vehicle operators to follow the route, and to notify motorists that they may encounter an ATV on the road.

This ordinance includes a means to travel from a residence within the limits of the Town of Quincy, Adams County, Wisconsin, for the shortest distance (on roadways within the jurisdiction of the Town of Quincy) that is necessary for a person to operate a ATV-UTV in order to reach an all-terrain route of travel that is closest to the residence.

This ordinance defines hours of ATV/UTV operation on designated Town of Quincy roads, road routes & trails. as defined.

Sunday thru Thursday 8:00 am. to 10:00 pm.

Friday and Saturday 8:00 am. To 11:00 pm.

This ordinance will take effect only after the road signs have been posted.

And the Ordinance has been published.
