Motion by Wysocky/LaDell to reduce the election workers to three for the February 20th Spring Primary. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Lifestar Ambulance request for the town to participate in Wisconsin's Tax Offset Program (TRIP). Tabled until town's attorney can review.

Temporary snowmobile route on Deerborn Drive tabled until Bill Hicks can attend and present map with exact locations. More information is needed.

Rustic Ridge Riders - submitted proposed ATV/UTV ordinance. Shaun Long present to answer questions regarding regulations on ATV/UTVs. Discussions held on:

Proposed ordinance - portions against state rules on ATV/UTVs

Town insurance will not cover rules set up by the town that are not conforming to state rules.

Who would cover costs of the signs required and labor.

Who would patrol the "road routes". Clubs ambassadors cannot patrol road routes - only trails. ASCD cannot not enforce town ordinances.

Town Board not comfortable with opening up roads without law enforcement.

Persons that were for and/or against were able to voice their concerns.

Possibility of town hiring ACSD personnel. Costs?

Letter from town's attorney.

Motion by Wysocky/LaDell - until investigation and have a full time police force; there will be no ATV road routes in the Town of Quincy. All were in favor. Motion carried.
